Budget Updates and Grant Program

Budget Update

- SB 1531 appropriated \$250,000 in funding to the Oregon Historical Society "to expend and allocate" to carry out the Commission's responsibilities. OHS also received \$10,000 from the federal commission.
- Total spent May 2024 August 2025: \$157,719.47.
- This does not include any contracted or allocated amounts.





Budget Updates and Grant Program

Grant projects for 2025/2026, Oregon Heritage/America 250 Oregon/OHS

The America 250 Oregon Commission has allocated \$100,000 of the funding provided by the Oregon State Legislature toward this grant program.

- Awards will be up to \$5,000 each.
- 50% of the funds are slated to be awarded to organizations in rural communities. For the purposes of this grant a rural community is under 30,000 in population and outside the Portland Metro urban growth boundary.

There will be two grant application periods:

- Cycle 1: September 15 November 1, 2025
- Cycle 2: January 1 March 1, 2026

Projects must support the America 250 Oregon mission and align with one of the guideposts that best fits your project.





America 250 Funding/Grants

National Endowment for the Humanities Celebrate America! Grant

Accepting and reviewing applications on a rolling basis throughout 2025.

In honor of the 250th anniversary of American Independence, the National Endowment for the Humanities is issuing a call for proposals for Celebrate America!, a new initiative to recognize the nation's semiquincentennial on July 4, 2026. Through this program, NEH will award 250 challenge grants of up to \$25,000 each for projects that focus on the founding of the American nation, key historical figures, and milestones that reflect the exceptional achievements of the United States.

Awards will be made using federal matching funds. As part of your application, you will need to certify that your organization has secured third-party, nonfederal gifts equal to the amount requested from NEH.

Sharing the Spirit of America

Simultaneous Reading of the Declaration of Independence Across America July 8, 2026

On July 4, 1776, the Second Continental Congress approved the Declaration of Independence inside the Pennsylvania State House (now Independence Hall) in Philadelphia.

Four days later, on July 8, 1776, after the Declaration was printed and distributed, the citizens of Philadelphia were summoned to the State House Yard by the bells of the city. Then, Colonel John Nixon publicly read the Declaration of Independence.

Just as the Declaration of Independence was read to the people on July 8, 1776, now, 250-years later, Americans in all 50 States and 16 Territories of the United States will read the Declaration of Independence 'together'. Each would start at the 'same' time, based on our respective local times.


Not only could you be the first person in 200 years to learn their stories, but your efforts will make a permanent contribution to the historical record in time for the 250th anniversary of the American Revolution!

America 250 Oregon Commission Discussion





We write on behalf of the America 250 Oregon Commission to update you on our progress and to ensure that you and your tribal citizens are aware of the opportunity to provide counsel to the Commission.

The enclosed legislation creating the Commission was passed by the Oregon State Legislature in March 2024 and signed into law by Governor Kotek. It entrusted the Commission with "coordinating, providing guidance, and ensuring that Oregon's official observance of the 250th anniversary of the founding of the United States on July 4, 1776, is inclusive and shared the histories of the Indigenous peoples who have resided here since time immemorial."

The legislation also established a subcommittee, consisting of one member from each of Oregon's nine federally recognized tribes. Members of this subcommittee are appointed by the Executive Officer of the Commission on Indian Services, who also has the duty of "communicating the positions of the nine federally recognized Indian tribes in Oregon to the America 250 Oregon Commission in order to uplift the tribes' histories and stories."

The website includes links to the websites of Oregon's nine federally recognized tribes, so that interested visitors can learn more about the history of the Indigenous peoples of Oregon.

It is our hope and the hope of the America 250 Oregon Commission that all of Oregon's tribal nations are aware of the opportunity to share thoughts and recommendations on how tribal histories and stories can be uplifted and highlighted in the months to come.
